DISCUSSION ON JULY 8

Another new house for Glencoe is on the way! South Street Minor Variance for 215 South Street was approved by council which will allow for the development of a new single family home.

Council discussed the number of meetings and chose to remain at status quo of two meetings per month, with the flexibility to have one meeting in August to accommodate holidays and the annual AMO conference.

The health and safety policy outlining the specific responsibilities for council, including providing for a health and safety management system, a hazard management program, legal and other requirements, as well as communication, participation and training was reviewed as required. The health and safety program is a legal obligation for every municipality and must be reviewed regularly.

McLean-Switzer Drain request was accepted by council for a request filed under Section 78 (1.1) (6) of The Drainage Act to enclose part of the McLean-Switzer Drain on the property of Rein Minnema, Range 1S PT Lot 11

Atax adjustment was approved for the property described as Ekfrid Con. 1 Pt Lot 5, RP33R20203 Parts 2 to 5 to change from residential to farm as recommended by MPAC.

Two reports were requested of staff. The first request is for consideration of an amendment to the election sign by-law through a staff report to council. The second request is concerning the new waste and recycling system that will commence in August, 2020. Several questions about multi residential and small business needs were answered - it was noted that all questions of property owners are best directed to staff at the municipal office to ensure that all needs are adequately met and any issues are tracked.
